Question for the program

EP.21.047 Human Development and Family Studies, BS:

Individualized Plan: The program states that students will select 16-18 credit hours from a

program list, but the list includes courses from the options for the major. A degree audit would count courses as meeting both requirements (which they don't) so we wanted to know how the process for each student would be monitored with the list.

Brianna Gregg (in ACES Office of Academic Programs) indicated that the DARS report can be set up to control for courses to only count in one area, even though the course is listed as an option in two places. Do we need to do something to plan ahead for this? Or do I need to add this language to the proposal?

Small editorial changes that can be made (Kathy can likely help with these)

EP.21.047, EP.21.048, EP.21.049 - Minimum total credit hours says 48, it should be

<u>EP.21.047</u> Cultural Studies: Update to the new language: Non-Western Cultures, US Minority Cultures, Western/Comparative Cultures.
