A. Undergraduate Programs

- 1) **Temporary Suspension of Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training in the College of Applied Health Sciences (key 1156)** – This program has not admitted students since the fall of 2008, as it was determined at that time, that the program would be phased down. The program, however, was never phased down. The department is in the midst of a large curriculum revision, and recently hired a faculty member who specializes in the areas of biomechanics and athletic training. In light of these recent developments, the department is requesting a temporary suspension of the program while they determine whether or not the program will be reinstated.
- 2) **Temporary Suspension of Admission to the concentration in Athletic Training in the Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology in the College of Applied Health Sciences (key 1157)** – This program concentration has not admitted students since the fall of 2008, as it was determined at that time, that the concentration would no longer be offered. The program, however, was never phased down. The department is in the midst of a large curriculum revision, and recently hired a faculty member who specializes in the areas of biomechanics and athletic training. In light of these recent developments, the department is requesting a temporary suspension of the program while they determine whether or not the program will be reinstated.
