This concentration program has not admitted students since the fall of 2008, as it was determined at that time, that the concentration would no longer be offered. The program, however, was never phased down. Our department is in the midst of a large curriculum revision, and recently hired a faculty member who specializes in the areas of biomechanics and athletic training. In light of these recent developments, we are requesting a temporary suspension of the program while we determine whether or not the program will be reinstated.
