Each course in the certificate program is either six or eight weeks long. You can choose to engage in one or more certificate program tracks. The program is hybrid synchronous and asynchronous. Each course has a required, once a week two-hour live Zoom session where students gather with their peers and the instructor. These live zoom sessions include lectures, activities, students' presentations, and other interactions involving the course content.

In order to qualify for the certificate, one must have completed an undergraduate degree. Some certificates require an undergraduate statistics course in order to proceed through the program. Following the application an interview is setup with the Associate Director of Graduate Online Programs to discuss program fit and the applicant's background. An admissions decision is made after the interview with the candidate. If a certificate student wants to pursue the master's degree following the completion of a certificate, they must then submit an application for the MHRIR program. That application would then require a personal statement along with three letters of recommendation. Certificate students can ask up to two of their instructors from the LER program to write letters for their master's application.

We have removed programs that are no longer accepting applications. (full-time and part-time residential MBA and MS Business Administration). We have added programs that were not previously listed as both programs are new (MSM and MS Business Analytics), and have adjusted the schedule of required courses to allow students in these programs to pursue these concentrations if they are interested. Both new programs are 9 months in length, the concentration courses can be completed during their second semester.

We added three courses that all align with the subject matter: New Product Development (BADM 525); Big Data Infrastructure (this previously had a temporary number and over the summer it was approved as BADM 558) and Project Management (BADM 589). BADM 557 also has a new name "Business Intelligence" to more accurately reflect the course content.

We are removing BADM 554 (four credit hours) for the following reasons:

• It is a core course for the MS Business Analytics program and is also a required course for the Business Data Analytics concentration.

• Not aligned well with the ITC concentration.

We are removing BADM 562 (Social Media Strategy). The Social Media Strategy course does not offer desired student learning value expected from the revised concentration. The new concentration aligns with current market needs, and the Social media strategy course is no longer a good fit with the revised concentration.
