MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:13 pm by Professor Emeritus H. George Friedman, Jr. serving as the Presiding Officer of the Senate with Sara Benson serving as Parliamentarian.

2. APPROVAL OF REMOTE PARTICIPATION

Remote participation was approved by unanimous consent.

3. APPROVAL OF FLOOR PRIVILEGES

The following floor privileges were granted by unanimous consent.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the November 11, 2024 meeting were approved as distributed by unanimous consent.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

The following faculty member spoke about concerns regarding the diversity, equity, and inclusion required statement by candidates for promotion.

6. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S REMARKS

Faculty senator and Senate Executive Committee (SEC) Chair Jon Hale (EDUC) provided updates on two items. First, the University Senates Conference (USC) approved a resolution regarding ST-83 that would extend the deadline for further comments from December 16, 2024 to March 15, 2025, and those comments would be submitted to USC instead of the President. Second, the Senate must approve the search committee composition for the next chancellor, following

Chancellor Jones' resignation. SEC has drafted SC.25.08, outlining the search committee's makeup and selection procedures, which the Senate will discuss and vote on. Chair Hale emphasized the tight timeline and the commitment to a transparent and fair process. Hale also thanked the Senate Office staff members and Chair of the Senate Committee on Committees for all their efforts to ensure the tight timeline can be met.

7. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

Bill Bernhard, Executive Vice Provost for Academic Affairs and Interim Associate Chancellor and Vice Provost for Budget and Resource Planning, shared remarks on behalf of Chancellor Robert Jones. Chancellor Jones is with an Illinois delegation in Saudi Arabia in part to meet with representatives from NEOM University. Provost John Coleman is attending the Big Ten Academic Alliance Board of Directors meeting in Chicago.

Vice Provost Bernhard noted that Chancellor Jones' visit to NEOM University is exploratory and no commitments have been made. His visit is intended to investigate potential collaborations and to address concerns about academic freedom, inclusivity, and other core values. No agreement will compromise the university's values or the safety of the university community. Bernhard discussed the university's international partnership strategy emphasizing a commitment to global engagement through collaborations with diverse institutions and noted that Illinois currently has over 400 global partners that focus on academic and scholarly exchange, not government initiatives. A key goal is to expand collaborations with universities in the Global South that align with the land-grant mission. Bernhard expects Chancellor Jones to provide a report upon his return.

Secondly, Bernhard highlighted that the university has surpassed 2,000 tenure-track faculty members for the first time in 15 years, reach a total of 2,056. This 4% growth is mainly attributed to the efforts of deans, department heads, and faculty creating a supportive environment. Over the past decade, there have been some hiring and retention challenges along side a growing student body. The milestone of 2,000 faculty should be celebrated on the university's path to further develop the pool of world-renowned educators and researchers. The university remains committed to further support faculty hires through initiatives like the Strategic Hiring Initiative and encouraging continued recruitment and retention efforts.

The third topic is "Boldly Illinois 2030" the launch of the university's new strategic planning framework. This plan builds on the success of the previous plan, and it provides guidance and encourages the university community to align activities with institutional values. Bernhard urged everyone to engage with the framework and utilize it in planning and directed them to the [Boldly Illinois 2030 webpage](#) for more information.

The fourth topic addressed the upcoming change in university leadership. Chancellor Jones will conclude his nine-year tenure as the end of this academic year. The search for his replacement is being launched by the University of Illinois system, beginning with the Senate's assistance in forming the search committee. While the System will manage the search, the university

community will be kept informed. Bernhard acknowledged the challenges of leadership transitions but assured everyone that Chancellor Jones is committed to a seamless process and will be available to assist with the transition during the roughly six-month search period.

Finally, Bernhard reminded everyone that the end of the semester is approaching, a time of excitement and celebration but also of stress, loneliness, and depression for some. He urged senators to support those who may be struggling by reaching out and connecting them with support resources. These resources include the counseling center, embedded counselors, faculty/staff assistants, workshops, and online options like the "Togetherall" peer-to-peer mental health support service for students. The goal is to ensure the end of the year is a positive experience for everyone. Information about these resources will be shared via mass mail this week, and the Graduate College and Student Affairs have already communicated directly with their respective students. Student Affairs has a [webpage](#) with a full listing of mental health and wellness resources.

8. QUESTIONS FROM SENATORS

Faculty senator Gilmore (LAS) commented that he would like more information about the Chancellor's trip to NEOM and the university's overall process for engaging with potentially challenging international partners. Gilmore noted the lack of clarity around this partnership process since it is not strictly educational policy. Bernhard will pass along these comments.

Faculty senator McDuffie (LAS) raised concerns about an incident on election night where individuals climbed the Alma Mater statue, placing a MAGA hat and Trump shawl on the statue. He also mentioned a Trump victory celebration near campus, featuring a photo of the Alma Mater incident and sponsored by Turning Point USA, a group with a history of anti-Semitism and student harassment. McDuffie requested clarification on the police's reporting structure and asked for his concerns to be relayed to the Chancellor. Bernhard noted that concerns were shared with the Chancellor and the Chancellor is thinking about different ways that the clarity you seek can be provided.

Faculty senator Yannarell (ACES) noted recent actions taken against the Students for Environmental Concern RSO (registered student organization) and its members following their annual climate march. Yannarell expressed concern about recent policy revisions and asked why the university made these changes and whether this approach will be the standard for handling future student protests. Bernhard responded that he was not familiar with this incident. The revisions to the expressive speech policies were not intended to suppress student speech but intended to ensure the safety for all campus members.

Faculty senator Beck (LAS) pointed out the absence of any mention of indigenous peoples in the Boldly Illinois 2030 document and asked about future plans to repair relationships with indigenous communities. Additionally, Beck expressed disappointment that the university has not addressed the legacy of Chief Illiniwek or created a new mascot, noting that many students and alumni feel the lack of a symbolic figure. Bernhard replied that unlike past strategic plans with

concrete actions, the Boldly Illinois framework focuses on core institutional values and missions. Bernhard acknowledged the absence of specific goals in the framework but assured that the university remains committed to issues of diversity and community relations, including those with Native American communities. The Chancellor and Provost continue their commitment to these concerns.

Student senator Holt (ACES) expressed concern about recent policy changes and that university's focus has switched to the Boldly Illinois 2030 initiative and external partnerships, rather than ensuring students feel accepted and belong. Bernhard noted that Provost's efforts surrounding civil discourse and engagement have emphasized the importance of open exchange around different ideas. The Provost continues to explore different models and best practices for fostering these experiences and Bernhard anticipates this exploration will lead to new approaches in the future.

Student senator Crystal (LAS) echoed previous concerns about student free speech and inquired about the process and timeline for making additional revisions, and noted the lack of student representation on the review committee. Bernhard confirmed that the impact of the recent policy changes is being monitored. Future changes will prioritize shared governance and include appropriate engagement with diverse voices in the review process, including students.

Faculty senator Clancy (LAS) expressed surprise at the recent rapid changes to the Campus Administrative Manual (CAM) and questioned the motivation for such changes. Clancy also mentioned a boarder point about transparency and shared governance and expressed frustration that these processes remain unclear and requested clarity be provided. Bernhard acknowledged the complexity of the university's policy landscape, noting the challenge of determining the appropriate policy document, authority, and process for various situations. The university is formalizing its consultation process with the Senate's Committee on General University Policy (GP) for CAM policies with faculty implications, allowing for feedback and referral to other Senate committees.

Faculty senator Ramirez (LAS) echoed previous concerns about recent CAM policy changes and expressed concern about possible vulnerabilities that students and faculty may face as the presidential inauguration approaches, especially related to undocumented and transgender individuals. Bernhard acknowledged shared concerns about vulnerable community members and affirms the administration are working to protect individuals against potential policy changes from the national administration. The current focus is on gathering information to understand the likely policy changes and then crafting a response. The goal is to ensure all community members feel welcome and can continue to access the opportunities afforded by the university.

9. CONSENT AGENDA

EP.24.109 was removed from the agenda by Nolan Miller, Chair of the Senate Committee on Educational Policy.

10. PROPOSALS

- a) **CC.25.14* Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate at the December 9, 2024 Senate Meeting**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), Chaya Sandler, Chair of C, presented and moved approval of the slate of nominees. Presiding Officer Friedman called for nominations from the floor. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve CC.25.14 was approved with 129 in favor, 0 opposed, and 4 abstentions.

- b) **EP.25.029, Establish the Department of Oncology in the Carle Illinois College of Medicine**
- c) **EP.25.030, Establish the Department of Surgery and Digestive Health in the Carle Illinois College of Medicine**
- d) **EP.25.031, Establish the Department of Cardiovascular Medicine and Surgery in the Carle Illinois College of Medicine**
- e) **EP.25.032, Establish the Department of Neurology and Neurosurgery in the Carle Illinois College of Medicine**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP) Nolan Miller, Chair of EP, summarized and moved approval of EP.25.029 through EP.25.032 as one motion. Miller noted that all statutory requirements had been met and that this structure aligns with how academic medical centers and clinical operations and hospitals are organized.

In response to a question regarding appointment types, Miller noted that appointments would largely remain the same but would not include the department designation.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve EP.25.029-32 was approved with 140 in favor, 2 opposed, and 3 abstentions.

f) HD.25.05 Nomination for Honorary Degree Award – Burrell, Khan

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Honorary Degrees (HD), Prasanta Kalita, Chair of HD read information from the proposal about both honorary degree candidates, and then moved approval of both candidates in one motion.

After a short discussion, a motion was made to divide the question. The motion to divide the question was approved by voice vote, and discussion about the candidates continued.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve an honorary degree for Burrell was approved with 133 in favor, 4 opposed, and 0 abstentions.

Senators engaged in further discussion regarding Khan as a candidate for an honorary degree. Dean of the Grainger College of Engineering, Rashid Bashir spoke in support of an honorary degree for Khan.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve an honorary degree for Khan failed with 37 in favor, 75 opposed, and 29 abstentions.

g) SC.25.08 Determine the Composition of, and Procedures for Selecting Members of, the Search Committee to Advise the President on the Selection of a Chancellor

On behalf of the Senate Executive Committee, Jon Hale, Chair of SEC provided background information about the SC.25.08 proposal stating that it was modeled after previous documents proposing the makeup and selection procedures for a search committee to select a new chancellor. Hale moved approval of the document stating the importance of the short timeframe to establish this important committee.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve SC.25.08 was approved with 133 in favor, 0 opposed, and 2 abstentions.

h) EP.25.026, Establish the Bachelor of Arts in Media in the College of Media

On behalf of EP, Nolan Miller, Chair of EP, introduced and moved approval of EP.25.026. Miller noted that this proposal is an online completion program designed for students who have some college but who did not complete a bachelor's degree. It is limited to transfer students and those applying for re-entry to the university. It is not open to enrollment by first-year students or by current students seeking intercollegiate transfer.

Faculty senator Roseman (LAS) made a motion to amend the original motion by adding the following:

Charge the Educational Policy Committee to establish a task force to craft governance procedures for the approval of online programs. This task force shall report back to the Senate in less than one calendar years' time.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to amend EP.25.026 was approved with 115 in favor, 3 opposed, and 4 abstentions.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve EP.25.026 as amended was approved with 106 in favor, 3 opposed, and 6 abstentions.

11. REPORTS FOR INFORMATION

a) EP.25.035* Report of Administrative Approvals Through December 9, 2024

b) UC.25.01* Report of Revisions to the USC Bylaws as of August 22, 2024

Chair of the University Senates Conference (USC), Jeffrey Eric Jenkins clarified that the amendment to the USC *Bylaws* made sure that instead of the chair of USC having the right to appoint members of committees for System committees from the USC, that the executive committee and the full USC would have voice and vote on the matter.
