

**UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS URBANA-CHAMPAIGN SENATE
MONDAY, FEBRUARY 10, 2025

MINUTES**

1. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:10 pm by Professor Emeritus H. George Friedman, Jr. serving as the Presiding Officer of the Senate with William J. Maher serving as Parliamentarian.

2. APPROVAL OF REMOTE PARTICIPATION

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

6. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR’S REMARKS

Faculty senator and Senate Executive Committee (SEC) Chair Jon Hale (EDUC) shared the following remarks. Hale noted that Chancellor Jones was announced as the next president of the University of Washington and expressed his gratitude for the nearly nine years of service, particularly Jones’ commitment to shared governance and his leadership during challenging times. Hale acknowledged the concerns regarding recent federal funding freezes/cuts and future changes in federal policies. The administration is committed to addressing these issues and Hale emphasized the importance of shared governance in navigating these challenges.

Chair Hale reaffirmed the Senate’s commitment to foundational values, maintaining a safe campus, and supporting historically underserved students. He also emphasized the vital role of Senate committees in addressing these issues and upholding shared governance. In particular, the Senate Committees on University Statutes and Senate Procedures, Academic Freedom and Tenure, Student Discipline, Education Policy, and Committees on Committees were noted. Senators are encouraged to actively participate in committee work and engage in open dialogue to ensure the Senate's effectiveness in protecting academic freedom, free speech, and the university's core values. The SEC will continue to work to create more pathways for senator’s concerns to be heard.

7. CHANCELLOR’S REMARKS

Chancellor Robert Jones shared the following remarks. Chancellor Jones emphasized the importance of shared governance in navigating the challenges posed by recent federal government directives. He highlighted the disruptive nature of these directives and the need for the university community to work together to understand and address their impact.

The Chancellor expressed concern about the wide-ranging and unclear nature of the directives, emphasizing the uncertainty and potential negative consequences for the university, particularly in areas like research funding and workforce. He stressed the

importance of adhering to university values while complying with the law, and the need to push back against executive orders where appropriate.

The Chancellor outlined the steps the university is taking to address these challenges, including the following. Forming a leadership team to focus on key areas like immigration, access, research funding, and workforce. Establishing communication channels to keep the community informed via a dedicated website and email address. Prioritizing the safety and well-being of the university community. He expressed confidence in the university's ability to overcome these challenges and emerge stronger.

Chancellor Jones reiterated his plan to leave the university in August to become president of the University of Washington. He expressed gratitude for his time at Illinois and emphasized his continued commitment to the university's success until his departure.

8. QUESTIONS FROM SENATORS

Faculty senator Gilmore (LAS) asked about the immediate impact of funding interruptions, particularly on employees who have multi-year contracts and collective bargaining agreements. He inquired about the university's plans to address these contractual obligations in the face of potential funding shortfalls.

The Chancellor emphasized that protecting the workforce is a primary concern in the face of funding interruptions. Units will first attempt to mitigate the impact, and if necessary the effort will escalate to the campus and possibly the system level. The university believes it has the financial capacity to address short-term funding issues.

Faculty senator Clancy (LAS) asked how the university plans to respond when its core values conflict with existing or future laws, especially concerning potential federal directives that might become law. She also called for the Joint Advisory Committee on Investments, Licensing, and Naming Rights to develop an ethical investment policy, arguing that ethical investing is both morally sound and financially viable, particularly during times of financial uncertainty.

The Chancellor reiterated the university's commitment to transparency regarding its investments and mentioned ongoing efforts to shift investments towards sustainability. The university is actively working with legal experts and other institutions to address the challenges posed by federal directives. Jones indicated a willingness to challenge orders when appropriate. He prepared to defend university values, even if there needs to be changes to the language used to talk about those values. Jones acknowledged the disruptive nature of the current situation, calling it one of the most significant challenges in the university's history, and asked for patience, engagement, and feedback from the Senate.

Student senator Venneberg (ENGR) asked where information about federal funding cuts could be found, especially those units that are most vulnerable to federal funding cuts. A

[website](#) has been created to post all available information regarding federal funding and policy changes. The university will continue to provide updates as information becomes available.

Faculty senator Cobb (ENGR) expressed concern about the federal administration's likelihood to enact laws that directly contradict the university's values. She mentioned a letter from the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) of Illinois criticizing the university's handling of student protests, particularly those by Students for Justice in Palestine (SJP).

Chancellor Jones expressed his unequivocal support for free expression and debate now and throughout his career. He affirmed his support for student protests, but within the established policies and practices of the university. He clarified that the ACLU letter stemmed from concerns about obstructing free access to the university and violating the law, not from issues of free expression itself.

Student senator Holt (DGS) asked what alternative funding methods are being explored in response to current and anticipated federal funding cuts. And given external pressure and government restrictions on protests, he asked what actions the university is considering to better support student free expression on campus.

Chancellor Jones stated the revisions to campus policy were intended to clarify the boundaries between lawful First Amendment expression and activities that create an unsafe environment. His primary responsibility is to ensure the safety and sense of belonging for all university members. The policy changes were not meant to stifle student protests that align with university policy, but to make sure the campus community remains safe. In response to the funding question, Jones noted that the university is taking aggressive action to address the funding issues and engaging legal services when necessary.

Faculty senator Rosas (LAS) expressed appreciation for the discussion on academic freedom and free speech, but also noted student frustrations from recent cuts to programs like BNAACC (Bruce D. Nesbitt African American Cultural Center), La Casa, and other cultural house as well as the police response to protests in April. He asked for consideration of these frustrations. He also asked if the university's working groups, formed to address the current challenges, would include one focused on gender and sexuality.

Chancellor Jones clarified that the budget adjustment for the cultural houses was not a targeted cut but part of a broader effort to adjust budgets across all units. BNAACC is a high priority for the university and Vice Chancellor Brown-Young is having clarifying conversations. Provost Coleman explained that the university asked all centrally budgeted administrative units to reduce spending to control central growth and maintain a balance between central and college-level spending.

Student senator Crystal (LAS) asked where prioritizing the safety and support of LGBTQ+ students and specifically trans students who it appears are being attacked.

Chancellor Joens confirmed that the issues of gender and sexuality will be addressed under the "expanding access" provision of the working groups. He emphasized that the university's definition of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) is broad, encompassing gender, race, and socioeconomic status. Socioeconomic status is a critical component of DEI. Programs like Illinois Commitment were started to address those socioeconomic gaps. Jones reiterated the university's commitment to inclusivity and the university will systematically address these issues.

9. PROPOSALS

a) **CC.25.16, Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate at the February 10, 2025 Senate Meeting**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), Linda Herrera, member of CC, presented and moved approval of the slate of nominees. Presiding Officer Friedman called for nominations from the floor.

Myles Johnson (ENGR) was nominated from the floor for the student vacancy on the Senate Committee on Information Technology (IT). A run-off election was held between Johnson and the CC nominee, Hannah Kuneyl (GRAD). The following vote totals were reported and Kuneyl was declared elected.

Marianne Alleyne (LAS) was nominated for the faculty vacancy on the Senate Committee on Research Policy (RP). A run-off election was held between Alleyne and the CC nominee, Rurik Tywoniw (LAS). The following vote totals were reported, and Alleyne was declared elected to RP.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, CC.25.16 was approved with 142 in favor, 1 opposed, and 2 abstentions.

b) **EP.24.109, Revise Section 3-201 of the Student Code (Final Examination Policy)**

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP) Nolan Miller, Chair of EP, introduced and moved approval of EP.24.109 which seeks to revise section 3-201 of the

Student Code concerning final examination policy. There has been a trend away from traditional final exams towards alternative assessments. The proposal includes updates to integrate alternative assessments, asynchronous exams, and potential conflicts into the existing policy. Any conflicts not resolved by the policy will be referred to the dean.

In response to a question, Miller noted that having both a written final exam and a project was allowed, but it must be announced in the syllabus or early in the semester.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, EP.24.109 was approved with 134 in favor, 3 opposed, and 3 abstentions.

c) LB.25.02, Resolution on Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries in Illinois (CARLI) Statement on the Importance of Librarians in Academic Libraries

On behalf of the Senate Committee on the Library (LB) Laura Payne, member of LB, introduced and moved approval of LB.25.02. This statement demonstrates how the importance of university libraries in the state is increasingly being recognized as being of fundamental importance for higher education in Illinois.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, LB.25.02 was approved with 134 in favor, 0 opposed, and 5 abstentions.

d) SP.23.10, Revision to the *Bylaws*, Part D.1.d – Senate Executive Committee; Part D.8.e – Committee on Educational Policy; and Part D.19 – Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures (Chair Compensation)

On behalf of the Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures (SP) Shawn Gilmore, member of SP, introduced and moved approval of SP.23.10. Gilmore noted that the proposal adds the chair of the University Statutes and Senate Procedures Committee to the list of compensated chairs and establishes a process for SEC to work with the Office of the Provost to determine and review the compensation structure every five years.

Faculty senator Tolliver (LAS) noted a contradiction in the proposed language – paragraph four states that the SEC and the Office of the Provost will "approve," and the *Bylaws* will "specify" which chairs are compensated. However, later sections already specify which chairs are compensated, creating an inconsistency. Tolliver also expressed concern about removing the half-time release language. Due to her concerns, Tolliver made a motion to return SP.23.10 to the SP committee. The motion was seconded and a vote followed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to return SP.23.10 to committee was approved with 56 in favor, 43 opposed, and 39 abstentions.
