MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:12 pm by Professor Emeritus H. George Friedman, Jr. serving as the Presiding Officer of the Senate with William J. Maher serving as Parliamentarian.

2. APPROVAL OF REMOTE PARTICIPATION

Remote participation was approved by unanimous consent.

6. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S REMARKS

Faculty senator and Senate Executive Committee (SEC) Chair Jon Hale (EDUC) shared the following remarks. Since the last meeting, the Senate continues to hear concerns connected to student and faculty safety which include critical inquiries about immigration enforcement on campus, Title VI, academic freedom, and the status of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) programming for the next academic year. Serious concerns have also been raised about federally funded grants and the repercussions this will have on graduate students and future research.

At the recent University Senates Conference (USC) meeting, discussion centered on a letter from multiple state attorneys general challenging a U.S. Department of Education *Dear Colleague Letter*, which they argue misinterprets Supreme Court precedent and discourages diversity considerations in policy making. The Senate reaffirms its commitment to DEI, shared governance, and academic freedom.

Looking ahead, while today's agenda is relatively light, meetings after spring break will be demanding. In April, the Senate will approve a response to the lingering issues related to academic freedom and ST-83, and to vote on the future of online programming and general education requirements. The Senate should remain vigilant and ready to defend core values. With the current political climate, there will certainly be work for each of the 21 Senate committees. The Senate remains committed to the University's core values and the ongoing work of shared governance.

Clerk of the Senate Jenny Roether shared the following announcements. To streamline the process for reporting excused absences and requesting remote participation, the Office of the Senate will implement a new online form. Senators will receive an email with additional information before the next Senate meeting.

A call for nominations for annual Senate committee vacancies was included in this week's Eweek announcements. Faculty, students, and academic professionals are encouraged to participate, regardless of whether they are elected senators. It is important that committee membership reflects the broader Senate membership to ensure cohesive and effective shared governance. Committee interest forms are due April 23. The Senate Committee on Committees (CC), which manages the annual and ongoing vacancy filling process, will need

to make nominations for about half of the seats across 20 of the 21 standing committees. If you missed the Eweek notice, a Massmail with direct links to nomination forms will be sent after spring break, and forms are also available on the Senate's homepage. Questions can be directed to any Senate Office staff member after the meeting, or later via email or phone.

7. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

On behalf of Chancellor Robert Jones, William Bernhard, Interim Associate Chancellor and Vice Provost for Budget and Resource Planning, shared the following remarks. Chancellor Jones is currently in Washinton, D.C., engaging in conversations on pressing federal issues. The federal landscape remains a central focus, and the University continues to rely on its steering group structure to monitor and interpret evolving federal orders and directives. This work is often challenging due to a lack of clarity and ongoing legal uncertainties surrounding federal guidance. Two key federal issues currently drawing the most attention are the February 14 *Dear Colleague Letter* from the U.S. Department of Education, and ongoing concerns about Facilities & Administrative (F&A) cost rates. The University remains committed to identifying and addressing the immediate impacts of these developments.

In response to the U.S. Department of Education's February 14 *Dear Colleague Letter*, which broadens the interpretation of the *Students for Fair Admissions v. Harvard* Supreme Court decision beyond admissions, the University has retained external legal counsel to assess its implications. The University is also collaborating with peer institutions and will communicate any necessary policy changes. Along with Illinois, several Attorney Generals have issued statements reaffirming the legality of DEI efforts and encouraging their continuation. The University remains committed to fostering diversity, accessibility, and academic excellence in alignment with its land-grant mission, though it acknowledges that difficult decisions may lie ahead.

Additionally, University leadership recognizes the risk of online harassment targeting scholars working in sensitive areas. Resources for those affected, including anti-trolling and doxing support, are available on the Office of the Provost website. The Office of Strategic Communications and Marketing also monitors social media for threats and informs relevant departments of potential risks.

The University addressed concerns about proposed reductions to Facilities & Administrative (F&A) rates, which are essential for supporting the infrastructure behind research including items such as facilities, support staff, and other institutional resources. In response, the University is supporting a lawsuit aimed at preventing the federal government from implementing a 15% cap on indirect cost rates for NIH (National Institutes of Health) grants. A nationwide preliminary injunction was issued this past Wednesday, temporarily halting the implementation of the cap. The State of Illinois is one of the plaintiffs, and the University of Illinois System has contributed supporting information demonstrating the

potential harm to Universities. While the legal process continues, the University is encouraged by the court's initial ruling.

The third topic is budget guidance to ensure the University's financial stability. The Office of the Provost has advised campus leaders, including deans, directors, and budget officers, to prioritize spending on core mission activities and avoid initiating or continuing non-essential programs. Deans and Vice Chancellors have also been instructed to prepare for discussions about how they plan to manage potential reductions in federal funding during upcoming budget meetings. This guidance comes from recommendations by the ad hoc task force formed by the Provost to address current and near-term funding challenges.

Fourth topic, the Discovery Partners Institute (DPI) is currently undergoing a transition. President Killeen appointed a steering committee to create a strategic framework for DPI's expanded vision, including input from the University Senates Conference (DPI) and the DPI Executive Committee. The draft report, which includes several options for consideration, has been submitted to President Killeen and will be presented as an informational item at the upcoming March Board of Trustees meeting. Key developments include: DPI relocating its headquarters to downtown Chicago; a new DPI site will open at the Illinois Quantum and Microelectronics Park (IQMP); Remaining state appropriations are expected to support capital needs at both locations; the expanded DPI vision emphasizes advancing the future of computing, aiming to position Illinois as a global leader in this rapidly evolving area; and the Urbana campus is expected to take a lead role in this effort.

On a positive note, the Carle Illinois College of Medicine has received full accreditation from the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) which is a major milestone for any new medical school. This achievement reflects the dedication of many individuals across campus and affirms the college's mission to train physicians who are also innovators. The program emphasizes interdisciplinary collaboration and the development of technology-driven solutions to improve healthcare systems and patient outcomes. Full accreditation allows the college to continue advancing its unique approach to medical education and healthcare innovation.

The Chancellor and senior leadership reaffirmed the vital role of land-grant research universities like the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign in serving the public good. The University aspires to be the nation's leading public research institution grounded in its land-grant mission – a mission rooted in excellence, service, and a commitment to the diverse people of Illinois. To truly serve the state, the University must understand, acknowledge, and celebrate the experiences and contributions of its population. Every member of the campus community plays a role in advancing this mission. Leadership is incredibly proud of the work that is done at Illinois, and incredibly proud of the talented faculty. Bernhard stated that everyone's work matters, and leadership will continue doing everything within their ability to provide support. Thank you for your partnership, your brilliance, and your relentless pursuit of a better world, even in face of tremendous uncertainty.

8. QUESTIONS FROM SENATORS

Faculty senator McDuffie (LAS) expressed concern about increasing threats to campus safety and civil liberties, noting the detention of a pro-Palestinian activist at Columbia University and ICE activity in Champaign-Urbana. McDuffie noted a climate of fear, particularly among marginalized students, and worried that vulnerable academic units might bear the brunt of difficult decisions.

In response, Bernhard clarified that faculty contacted by the FBI should inform University Counsel, who will offer guidance. The University has a working relationship with the local FBI to handle interactions appropriately. Additionally, the University has issued guidelines on ICE activity, stating that while ICE can access public spaces, it cannot enter private areas like offices or dorms without proper authorization.

Faculty senator Ramirez (LAS) expressed concern about the weaponization of Title VI to suppress academic freedom and harass scholars. She asked how the University is protecting faculty, ensuring fair handling of complaints, and whether the Title VI office (with only 1.5 staff) has adequate support to manage its growing caseload.

Bernhard acknowledged concerns about the impact of Title VI enforcement on academic freedom and free speech, noting the tension between protecting individuals and preserving open discourse. Vice Chancellor for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Sean Garrick is forming a faculty group to review the Title VI processes. Regarding staffing, the office currently has 1.5 employees, but additional positions have been approved, and hiring is underway.

Faculty senator Beck (LAS) urged administration to provide clearer, campus-wide guidance on how to handle federal agency interactions like the FBI or ICE and the *Dear Colleague Letter*. He emphasized the need for support and clarity, especially for faculty working with federal grants or facing online harassment.

Bernhard emphasized the complexity and evolving nature of current federal issues, urging patience as the University works to ensure any actions or guidance align with legal obligations and institutional values. Bernhard urged caution and not to prematurely complying with unclear directives. Additionally, only granting agencies, not the FBI, can alter the status of federal grants.

Faculty senator Barrow (LAS) raised concerns about losing grant funding and its impact on programs and students. Bernhard acknowledged the challenge and emphasized that departments should plan to provide bridge funding, especially to support graduate students. This was part of the budget guidance shared with deans and directors. For pre-tenured and tenured faculty affected by funding disruptions, the University is exploring options, including possible tenure clock rollbacks and protections for scholars whose research may be significantly impacted. Conversations are ongoing within the University and with peer institutions to develop responses.

Faculty senator Cobb (ENGR) asked for specifics on the difficult financial decisions ahead and reassurance of support for vulnerable departments such as Asian American Studies, African American Studies, and Gender and Women's Studies. Bernhard recognized the uncertainty of the current budget situation which made it difficult to provide specifics. Leadership is prioritizing the academic mission and looking at central campus cuts to protect colleges' core functions. The administration is committed to transparency in decision-making.

9. PROPOSALS

a) CC.25.19, Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate at the March 10, 2025 Senate Meeting

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), Linda Herrera, CC member, presented and moved approval of the slate of nominees. Presiding Officer Friedman called for nominations from the floor. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, CC.25.19 was approved with 140 in favor, 0 opposed, and 2 abstentions.

b) CC.25.17, Faculty Nominations to the 2025-2026 Athletic Board

On behalf of CC, Linda Herrera, CC member, presented and moved approval of the slate of nominees. Presiding Officer Friedman called for nominations from the floor. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, CC.25.17 was approved with 137 in favor, 1 opposed, and 4 abstentions. The slate of nominees will be forwarded to the Chancellor for the appointment of 2 faculty members.

c) CC.25.18, Student Nominations to the 2025-2026 Athletic Board

On behalf of CC, Linda Herrera, CC member, presented and moved approval of the slate of nominees. Presiding Officer Friedman called for nominations from the floor. There were no nominations from the floor and nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, CC.25.18 was approved with 131 in favor, 1 opposed, and 5 abstentions. The slate of nominees will be forwarded to the Chancellor for the appointment of 2 student members.

d) SC.25.11, Election of Student Senators to Fill Vacancies on the 2024-2025 Committee on Committees

On behalf of the Senate Executive Committee (SEC), Chair Hale moved approval of SC.25.11 noting that the three students will serve the remainder of the academic term.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, SC.25.11 was approved with 138 in favor, 1 opposed, and 2 abstentions.

e) SP.23.10, Revision to the *Bylaws*, Part D.1.d – Senate Executive Committee; Part D.8.e – Committee on Educational Policy; and Part D.19 – Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures (Chair Compensation)

On behalf of the Senate Committee on University Statutes and Senate Procedures (SP) David Dalpiaz, Chair of SP, introduced and moved approval of SP.23.10. Dalpiaz noted previous concerns by faculty senator Tolliver (LAS) at the last meeting. The revised proposal addresses most concerns. Former SP Chair Shawn Gilmore emphasized the importance of approving the proposal in order to include the SP Chair in those chairs that are compensated.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to approve SP.23.10 was approved with 127 in favor, 4 opposed, and 10 abstentions.
