A. **Graduate Program**

1) Temporary Suspension of Admission to the Concentration in Acting in the Master of Fine Arts in Theatre in the College of Fine and Applied Arts and the Graduate College — The acting concentration regularly admits a cohort of students every three years. The next cycle was to be entry for the 2025-2026 academic year. Instead, a temporary suspension is requested to allow for one year of curricular revisions with no active students. The current cohort of students (8) are all graduating in May 2025. Therefore, no students will be enrolled in the concentration for the 2025-2026 academic year while the curricular revisions are determined and submitted for approval. The next cohort of students in the acting concentration will apply to begin in the 2026-2027 academic year.
