University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate Monday, September 15, 2025 Illini Room A and Zoom Minutes

1. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign Senate was called to order at 3:10 pm by Rurik Tywoniw serving as the Presiding Officer of the Senate with William J. Maher serving as Parliamentarian.

2. LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

Faculty senator and Chair of the Senate Executive Committee (SEC), Angie Lyons (ACES), read the land acknowledgement statement:

As a land-grant institution, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign has a responsibility to acknowledge the historical context in which it exists. We are currently on the lands of the Peoria, Kaskaskia, Peankashaw, Wea, Miami, Mascoutin, Odawa, Sauk, Mesquaki, Kickapoo, Potawatomi, Ojibwe, and Chickasaw Nations. It is necessary for us to acknowledge these Native Nations and for us to work with them as we move forward as an institution with Native peoples at the core of our efforts.

3. APPROVAL OF REMOTE PARTICIPATION

Remote participation was approved by unanimous consent.

6. SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S REMARKS

SEC Chair Lyons welcomed senators to the first meeting of the 2025–2026 academic year and thanked members for their service. She highlighted two major agenda items: the establishment of the Ninth Senate Review Commission (SR9) and the formation of an ad hoc committee to review the honorary degree process. SR9 will begin work October 1, with a final report due to the SEC by April 15, 2026. The ad hoc committee will report by December 19, 2025.

Chair Lyons emphasized the importance of shared governance, respectful dialogue, and active participation in Senate committees. She recognized members of the Senate Executive Committee, Senate committee Chairs, the Office of the Senate staff, parliamentarians, and the Presiding Officer for their leadership and service.

Recognition of Senate Leadership
 Certificates of appreciation were presented to H. George Friedman Jr., inaugural
 Presiding Officer of the Senate, and John Hale, 2024–2025 SEC chair.

7. REVIEW OF PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

Senate Parliamentarian William J. Maher presented an overview of <u>parliamentary</u> <u>procedure</u>, including guidance on agenda preparation, use of the consent agenda, speaking and voting protocols, amending motions, and compliance with the Illinois Open Meetings Act (OMA).

8. PROPOSALS

a) EP.26.019, Establish the Social & Behavioral Science Institute as a Permanent Institute in the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research and Innovation
 On behalf of the Senate Committee on Educational Policy (EP), Chair Nolan Miller introduced and moved approval of EP.26.019. Miller noted that the Institute began in

2019 and has over 200 faculty affiliates from 14 colleges. Following strong support from faculty affiliates, the advisory council, and University leadership, EP held a public hearing and solicited written feedback, all of which was positive. EP unanimously approved the proposal.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt EP.26.019 was approved with 147 in favor, 1 opposed, and 1 abstention.

b) CC.26.11, Election of Members on Standing Committees of the Senate at the September 15, 2025 Senate Meeting

On behalf of the Senate Committee on Committees (CC), Chair Chaya Sandler presented and moved approval of CC.26.11 to fill current committee vacancies.

Presiding Officer Tywoniw called for nominations from the floor. Hearing none, floor nominations were declared closed.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt CC.26.11 was approved with 168 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstentions.

c) SC.26.03, Establish the Ninth Senate Review Commission

On behalf of SEC, Chair Lyons introduced and moved approval of SC.26.03. SEC Vice-Chair Gilmore added that the previous review led to the creation of the Senate Committee on Research Policy and encouraged broad participation and feedback throughout the review process.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt SC.26.03 was approved with 175 in favor, 0 opposed, and 1 abstention.

d) Election of the Ninth Senate Review Commission (SR9) CC.26.12-16

e) SC.26.04, Establish the Ad Hoc Committee on the Honorary Degree Awards Process
On behalf of the Senate Executive Committee (SEC), Chair Angie Lyons introduced and
moved approval of SC.26.04. Lyons noted this committee will focus on improving
procedures while protecting nominee privacy, allowing SR9 to address other areas.
Senators robustly discussed the committee's purpose, overlap with the existing Senate
Committee on Honorary Degrees, and recent events that seem to be prompting the
review.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt SC.26.04 failed with 48 in favor, 95 opposed, and 26 abstentions.

- f) Election of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Honorary Degree Awards Process CC.26.17-19 Establishing the Ad Hoc Committee on the Honorary Degree Awards Process failed. Therefore, on behalf of CC, Chair Sandler withdrew the following items.
 - CC.26.17, Election of Faculty Members to the Ad Hoc Committee on the Honorary Degree Awards Process
 - CC.26.18, Election of a Student Member to the Ad Hoc Committee on the Honorary Degree Awards Process
 - CC.26.19, Election of an Administrative Member to the Ad Hoc Committee on the Honorary Degree Awards Process
- g) EP.24.068, Adopt a Campus-wide Definition of Upper Division Coursework and Impose a Minimum Requirement of 40 Upper-Division Hours on All Undergraduate Students On behalf of EP, Chair Miller introduced and moved approval of EP.24.068. Miller added that this proposal works to align University policy with state standards. A task force was created to review the issue and found broad support across the colleges. Most programs already meet the requirement. However, there are some challenges, particularly in the College of Agricultural, Consumer & Environmental Sciences (ACES). The proposal

defines upper-division courses as 300- and 400-level courses plus designated 200-level courses approved by units. The requirement would apply to students entering in Fall 2028.

Senators raised concerns about maintaining flexibility for innovative programs and allowing possible waivers from the 40-hour upper-division requirement. Questions were asked about how 200-level courses would be designated and confirmation was given that the change would apply only to students entering in Fall 2028. Additional comments emphasized preserving academic freedom, supporting general education, and ensuring that programs retain flexibility in defining upper-division coursework.

By i-clicker and show of hands, and Poll Everywhere, the motion to adopt EP.24.068 was approved with 116 in favor, 32 opposed, and 14 abstentions.

9. Public Comment

Timothy Bretl, Professor and Associate Head of Aerospace Engineering, expressed concern about faculty academic freedom in classroom instruction. David Forsyth, Chair of the Senate Committee on Academic Freedom and Tenure (AF) responded that the *Statutes* and established procedures exist to address alleged infringements of academic freedom and noted administrators who threaten tenure demonstrate a lack of familiarity with those processes.

10. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

Chancellor Charles Isbell addressed the Senate for the first time, expressing gratitude for the warm welcome and emphasizing his commitment to collaboration, shared governance, and open, respectful dialogue. He reflected on his first two months in office, highlighting the University's tradition of interdisciplinary excellence and its potential to lead national conversations about the future of public higher education.

The Chancellor reported a record total enrollment of 60,848 students, including the largest first-year class in University history (9,207 students), and international enrollment of 1,410 students from 62 countries. He also noted that 72% of new students are from Illinois, emphasizing the University's strong service to the state.

He provided a brief update on the U.S. Department of Justice complaint filed against Illinois' in-state tuition and scholarships for undocumented students, explaining that the matter is under review by the Office of University Counsel in coordination with other state universities. He closed by expressing optimism about the University's mission, the importance of shared purpose, and his eagerness to continue working closely with the Senate and the broader campus community.

11. QUESTIONS FROM SENATORS

Concerns about international faculty and staff, along with students, were expressed. The Chancellor noted that International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) were addressing the issues and efforts were ongoing.

The Chancellor was asked if he would oppose the formation of a tenure-line faculty union. He replied that his opinion on the matter was irrelevant.

A question was asked about Title VI complaints, data on cases, and safeguards to ensure confidentiality. Gio Guerra Pérez, Interim Vice Chancellor for the Office of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, stated that an accounting of Title VI cases would be provided in November 2025, following a deadline with the U.S. Department of Education.

A motion was made to extend the meeting beyond the 5:15 pm end time. The motion was seconded and approved by voice vote.

In response to concern about doxxing and the impact on individuals, the Chancellor acknowledged the difficult situation and highlighted that the University offers resources and support for those targeted by such campaigns.

The Chancellor responded to a question about what was being done to support vulnerable departments and populations. He noted that he and other University leaders were having ongoing discussions to address these challenges and protect the University's mission.

In response to a question about how the administration would protect faculty, students, and staff from unreasonable federal demands, the Chancellor stated the University must follow the law, but will also uphold its core values, including academic freedom. The Office of University Legal Counsel will address any disagreements over the law's interpretation.
