SC.26.05 Election of a Graduate Student Senator to the 2025-2026 Committee on Committees

BACKGROUND

The Senate Committee on Committees (CC) includes student representation as outlined in Part D.6.b of the Senate *Bylaws*. Two student senators, one undergraduate and one graduate or professional student, serve on the committee. Additionally, a designated seat is held by the Deputy Speaker of the Illinois Student Council or the Deputy's designee.

Nominations for the CC shall be made by the incumbent Senate Executive Committee (SEC). Nominations may also be made for student committee positions by student senators. Each nomination shall be accompanied by the consent of the nominee. Nominees must be student senators at the time the committee term begins. (*Bylaws* Part D.6.c.1)

At the 2025-2026 Elections and Organizational meeting of the Senate in Spring 2025, no graduate student senators were nominated for the graduate/professional student senator vacancy, and the seat remained vacant.
