Proposal for revision of Stage Management Concentration in the Department of Theatre

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

This revision of the BFA Stage Management Concentration has been prepared in an effort to bring the curriculum up to date with current management practices in the contemporary theatre.

The specifics are as follows:

- 1. Replace THEA 199 Undergraduate Open Seminar with THEA 450 Management Seminar.
- 2. Replace THEA 222 Introduction to Scenic Design and THEA 231 Introduction to Stage Lighting with THEA 220 Survey of Design.
- 3. Remove THEA 391 Individual Topics; THEA 446 Costume History and Design, II; THEA 465 Musical Theatre History.
- 4. Add THEA 408 AEA Union Stage Management; THEA 409 Stage Management Workshop.
- 5. Add THEA 456 Properties Design.
- 6. Reduce credit requirement for THEA 451 from 4 credits to 3 credits.

JUSTIFICATION:

OLD REQUIREMENT

- 1. THEA 450 Stage Management Seminar was created to replace this section of THEA 199.
- 2. THEA 220 Survey of Design combines introductory content covered in THEA 231 Stage Lighting and THEA 222 Scenic Design.
- 3. These courses are no longer central to the contemporary pedagogy of the program.
- 4. These courses have been created to focus the program on the contemporary theatre with an emphasis on professional practices by current national and international companies.

NEW REQUIREMENT

- 5. This course will provide students with practical knowledge of props and prop storage.
- 6. Undergrads will now take this course for 3 credits, graduates will take it for 4 credits.

These changes clearly adhere to the goals set out in the Vice Chancellor's "Academic Plan for the Urbana-Champaign Campus" as follows:

- ongoing peer to peer contact with faculty and staff in Management Seminar will help students "acquire an attitude which reflects curiosity" and a "desire to continue to learn."
- multi-cultural guest speakers in Stage Management Workshop will help give students a chance to "acquire a deep understanding of our heterogeneous culture."
- offering a course in AEA Union Stage Management will provide "professional preparation that goes beyond basic abilities."
